Our Mission

The mission for Fresno Unified School District Peer Mentoring Program is to create positive peer relationships that will provide social emotional and academic support to students to increase their engagement and success in school.

What is Peer Mentoring?

Peer Mentoring Program is an afterschool program that matches successful students (peer mentors) with middle school students (feeder schools) or younger high school students in a peer relationship. Students meet one day a week after school at the middle or high school.

Program Requirements

Mentors:

- ✓ Current sophomore, junior or senior in high school
- ✓ Must have a desire to work with peers
- ✓ Completed FUSD Student Application and Work Permit
- ✓ Eligibility G.P.A. of 2.5 or higher
- ✓ Attendance rate of 90% or above
- ✓ Attend required trainings

Mentees:

- ✓ Interest in becoming a Mentee
- ✓ Completed Peer Mentor Application/Parent Permission
- ✓ Release Form
- ✓ Attend required Orientation
